1. Call to Order by Heather at 12:14pm
2. Introductions - Melanie, Erica, Heather, Elena. No new people in attendance.
3. Minutes from Previous Meeting September 21, 2022
  - a. Adopted minutes as presented with all outstanding errors and omissions corrected.
  - b. Correction to Heather Gerlinsky's name (corrected from Gerliniski to Gerlinsky, 2nd by Melanie, No opposition. Carried.
4. School Report - presented by Elena
  - a. Athletics - soccer and cross country running
    - i. Soccer - lost most games. At tournament, teams improved and narrowed the margins.
  - b. Other Clubs: Tech Force, Beyblades, Safety Patrol

- i. Safety Patrol supervisor came from AMA to observe and offer suggestions. Pylons will be placed along the curb to prevent parking. Also suggested contacting RCMP for parking violations at intersection. Elena will be contacting RCMP.

- e. Planned November Activities:

- f. Student Led Conferences
  - i. November 30th, December 1st
  - ii. In person but online sign up
- g. Our School Survey/2021-2022 Learning Results
  - i. Predictable lower achievement in reading and math. Had 30 kids register in January 2022. Interventions in place but may take more than a year to fill gaps (expected 2-3 years)
  - ii. Large gaps seen with some students not attending school for 2 years
  - iii. Anecdotal feedback: need to re-teach how to interact, how to work as a group, how to learn collaboratively. Seeing lots of playground behaviour issues. Started the Fill Your Bucket idea school wide (using manners, helping out, helping a friend)
  - iv. Results in student feedback in feelings of safety - most things were typical, but a lot of students identified having feelings of not being safe. Every school in Lloydminster had this feedback. Questions posed at round table were:
    - 1. why is there a general feeling of anxiety? Covid? Is it related to specific instances witnessed on the playground?
    - 2. Feelings of unsafety may be related to swearing as well.
  - v. Balance between needs of individual students and the school as a whole - At this time, the focus is on reeducating students about violence, how to appropriately respond to anger

and/or violence (their own and others), understanding what is in your control and what is not and taking responsibility for our own actions.

1. SHINE program is addressing some of these issues by providing strategies. Teachers are present during the SHINE lessons, so are aware of strategies being taught. Not a lot of strategies are currently used by students without coaching in the moment.
2. Teachers are encouraged to intervene in the moment on the playground when problems are seen.

vi. Currently at 385 students but a lot of in and out movement - still fluctuations. Student population would need to be over 400 for Vice Principal to go back to full time.
